QUICK FACTS

- Propane is an approved clean fuel listed in the 1990 Clean Air Act. It's not hazardous to drinking water or marine ecosystems.
- Buses powered by propane don't expose students to emissions that can aggravate asthma.
- Propane doesn't harm soil because it can't be spilled — it evaporates into the air.
- Using propane reduces the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide and air pollutants like carbon monoxide and nitrogen oxide.



Propane vehicles emit fewer greenhouse gas emissions than diesel vehicles.



Propane school buses help keep the air cleaner around students and their neighborhoods.



Electricity is the only clean energy option available.
